Objectives

- To examine immigrants' settlement and integration experiences and outcomes
 - Four provinces of the new Western CIC region
- To provide information that may inform policies, programs, services, and resources to improve settlement outcomes
- Focus today on use of internet, desire for pre-arrival information, economic integration, and feelings of belonging

Methodology

- > 2936 immigrants
 - Minimum 18 years of age
 - Living in one of the western provinces for 3-60 months
 - Permanent resident in Canada within last 5 years
- British Columbia: 744 respondents
- Alberta: 729 respondents
- Saskatchewan: 713 respondents
- Manitoba: 750 respondents
 - Margin of error +/- 4%; confidence level of 95%

Methodology

Computer-assisted telephone interviewing

- Social Sciences Research Laboratories (U Sask)
 - Manitoba
 - British Columbia
 - 30,060 calls (27% response rate)
- Population Research Laboratory (U of A)
 - Alberta
 - Saskatchewan
 - 18,103 calls (38% response rate)

Methodology

Survey Instrument


- Subset of questions from Alberta Settlement Outcomes Survey (edited to CLB5)
 - 6 new questions added
 - Majority used 7-point scales
- English, French, Mandarin, Punjabi, Spanish
- PRL surveys: 90% completed in English
- > 23 minutes to complete



Length of Time in Province




Immigration Category




Information Needs & Use; Use of Internet


Where Settlement Information was Accessed




Where Family and Friends Obtained Information




Ease of Internet Use Pre-Arrival



Ease of Internet Use Within First 6 Months After Arrival





Services Useful Prior to Arrival




Economic Integration

Current Employment Status






Skill Utilization




Difficulty in Finding a Job that Makes Use of Qualifications




Sense of Belonging
