The University of New Brunswick (Fredericton) seeks qualified candidates for a Research Associate position in the Department of Economics with specialization in Biostatistics or Epidemiology. This is for a 5-year term position. Applications should be received no later than **December 15, 2013**.

The successful candidate will plan and direct studies to investigate the determinants of human health, disease, health service use and/or health-related behaviors using administrative, survey and clinical data sources. The successful candidate will be employed by UNB to design, lead and contribute to large-scale research projects on various dimensions of health in New Brunswick and the Maritimes, including health indicators, health service delivery, health outcomes and preventing chronic disease. These research projects will have been approved for support by the Maritime SPOR SUPPORT Unit, a new CIHR-funded health research program, or will be priority health-related research questions originating from the Government of New Brunswick.

The position will commence on March 1, 2014, subject to budgetary approval. The ideal candidate will hold a Ph.D. or equivalent in epidemiology, biostatistics, health economics or related discipline; will have a minimum of three years relevant experience in a health research environment and experience in the manipulation and analysis of large and complex datasets. The ability to utilize and manipulate statistical programs including STATA, SAS and/or R, will be an asset.
