

Grant requests of up to \$10,000 will be considered; grants above this amount may be considered from time to time. Grants are accepted from registered charities and qualified donees across Canada. Ontario Trillium Foundation (Province-Wide and Community)	The Ontario Trillium Foundation distributes its funding to charities and not-for-profits through three granting programs: Community and Province-Wide programs and the Future Fund. Within those programs, funding is allocated in four sectors: Arts and Culture, Environment, Sports and Recreation, and Human and Social Services. Canadian Tire Jumpstart	Canadian Tire Jumpstart is a charitable program that helps financially disadvantaged children participate in organized sports and recreation by covering the costs of registration, equipment and/or transportation. 


