Myth Busters Campaign


This program debunked myths about immigrants using a variety of vehicles:

- Provided training to a "myth busters action team of "Ambassadors" for debunking myths when they show up in everyday life




Local Immigration Partnerships (LIPs)

- Well positioned to tackle public anxiety about immigration (partnerships with RCMP, etc.)
- Focus is on community/neighbourhoods
- Look at intersectionality approach (housing, employment, education, etc.)
- Where does this anxiety stem from?
 - “They are taking away our jobs”
 - “My child is a minority in school”
 - “Our neighbourhoods are changing”
