



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

- Over 85 + people of the community attended the simulation.
- Allowed participants to feel what it may have been like to face so many decisions as a refugee family trying to survive in war/drought/or political unrest
- Many who participated left with a better understanding of refugees and their plight to leave everything they had known and venture to an unknown country- even though it is generally not their choice.


- Survey supported IRCC planning and ranked newcomer client needs, systemic barriers, capacity-building and client-referral pathway priorities

Entrepreneur Survey

The Greater Moncton Local Immigration Partnership has developed an online survey to gather insight from the region's immigrant entrepreneurs. This insight will be used in the development of programming to support these business owners in the years ahead and create a positive environment for new entrepreneurs in the area.

Among the immigrant entrepreneurs, a few interesting highlights include:

- The survey was filled out by entrepreneurs from 14 different countries of origin.
- Networking and mentoring are the two top services that would help immigrant entrepreneurs be successful in the region.
- Most of the entrepreneurs are not aggressively promoting themselves through traditional media and other marketing channels.
- The top challenge faced by these entrepreneurs is generating sales. Other challenges include the business environment, government regulation/tax system and recruiting/retaining staff.



Building Capacity Together: a Toronto LIP Project

- Objective: to enhance the capacity of frontline staff who work with vulnerable newcomers through a series of Train-the-Trainer workshops.
- Joint project of the 5 Toronto LIPs, led by Toronto South LIP.
- Funded by the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services.
- 12 full day workshops on 9 individual topics delivered over a 1 year period.
- Curriculum co-designed by LIP staff and community experts.
- Topics include: Access to City Services, Developing Mental Health Protocols, Outreach, Anti-Oppression, Combatting Mental Health Stigma, Serving Newcomers with Limited English Ability and Formal Education, Housing.
- 420 front-line staff trained in a train-the-trainer model.

CK LIP Recommendations for Future Practice: Research Report

- In October 2017, CK LIP began a research project that involved a mixed-method approach, and included an analysis of the 2016 census data, a literature review, focus group discussions and surveys.
- One recommendation included adopting a more focused action plan with measurable indicators around selected welcome-ability dimensions, including health, social and economic factors
- Findings will continue to guide the work of CK LIP in the future
- CK LIP released the findings of their research to the community at the 2018 CK LIP Community Forum, held on March 20, 2018.

The Ottawa Newcomer Health Centre

The Ottawa Newcomer Health Centre is one of OLIP's high impact achievements. Established collaboratively by the Somerset West Community Health Centre and the Catholic Centre for Immigrants in 2010 with funding from the Champlain LHIN, the Centre focuses on providing a bridging pathway for refugees to access health care. The Centre grew from 1 pilot program in 2010 to 4 permanent programs, including:

1. A medical clinique that bridges refugees to health care,
2. A centralized systems that sources language interpretation services for health care providers
3. A team of multicultural health navigators that assist newcomer families find and access health and social services
4. A mental health counselling program, added most recently in 2018

The Ottawa Newcomer Health Centre embodies our Partnership's success in:

- Strategic alignment with the Champlain LHIN, who prioritized investment in newcomer health
- Fostering high trust and collaboration by partners in different sectors
- Knowledge sharing and mobilization between sectors. The Centre's programs are designed drawing from the knowledge of multiple sectors.

Interestingly, the ONHC advances our partnership's employment goals as well, with 94% of the Centre's staff being first or 2nd generation immigrants.


