Pathways to Prosperity (P2P) is seeking nominations of promising practices from a variety of stakeholders involved in the settlement and integration of immigrants and refugees across Canada. Practices do not have to be IRCC funded to be nominated.

Promising practices are practices that have an objective basis for claiming effectiveness in achieving their stated aims and that have the potential for replication. Thus, promising practices are defined in terms of their effectiveness, which can be empirically measured as successful outcomes of the practice. Please ensure that your nomination fits these criteria.

In the current round, promising practices should focus on one (or more) of the following areas: promoting welcoming communities, language instruction in the workplace, information and orientation, supports for youth and addressing intergenerational issues, adapting settlement services and supports for rural and remote communities, and housing supports.
