ICYP will use new survey technology to increase youth engagement. Using Rival Technology's *Chat Lab* platform, survey questions will be sent one-by-one in a conversation

pilot study *Immigration in Canada: Youth Perspectives* (ICYP) was created. ICYP will gather data on youths':

- access to accurate immigration-related information
- social relationships (i.e. friendships)
- participation in social activities
- feelings of belonging
- perceptions of newcomer- host community member relationships (i.e. intergroup climate)

Examining these results as a function of the pre-existing level of diversity within participants' secondary schools will allow for an exploration of the relationship

## **Research Questions:**

This study seeks to examine the relationship between intergroup relationships, access to information, and positive integration experiences. Specifically, this data will help to answer questions, such as:

How does the level of pre-existing diversity in schools relate to the intergroup climate and social integration among youth?
How does access to accurate information affect integration?
Where do youth make intergroup friendships?

The percentage of immigrants and refugees in Winnipeg School 70 **Division Secondary** 60 Schools ranges widely 50 (1.2% to 62.7%). We aim 40 30 for a sample size of 400 20 participants from 11 10 Winnipeg School Division schools.
