- Funded by Immigration,
 Refugees and Citizenship and Canada (IRCC)





- For pre-arrival IENs in their countries of residence who are planning immigration to Canada
- Supports and services designed to shorten the time that IENs spend from arrival in Canada to professional registration and employment
- Free with:
 - ✓ Proof of graduation from a nursing school
 - ✓ Proof of immigration confirmation



- Individual online case management and guidance (Skype or GoTo Meeting)
- Over 110 hours of virtual programming (live with pre-recorded options)
 - > Live information, orientation and employment webinars
 - Online nursing-specific English communication courses
- Mentorship connections to senior/expert nurses through Canadian Nurses Association
- Referrals upon arrival in Canada



Case Management

- Conduct intake and comprehensive assessment
- Engage with participants in secure manner over email,
 Skype, GoTo Meeting
- Create action plan, dependent upon needs, date of arrival and province of destination
- Provide timely support and guidance
- Facilitate connections with meaningful health, employment and settlement referrals in province of destination

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Enhanced Nursing Communication Skills (ENCS)


