






The Community Data Network

The Consortium Model

- A consortium: Legal group of organizations focused on the implementation of a public service goal
- One consortium for each “local” region
 - Examples include Red Deer, Waterloo Region, York Region, New Brunswick and Winnipeg
- Functions as a Community Development entity
- The Lead for each consortium participates in the leadership and development of the CDP


