Adjusting

Immigrant women have a brand new world to get used to

- Adjust to the new culture
- Adjust to a new language and landscape
- Look for new ways to earn money



Many immigrant women are looking for

- Freedom
- Equal opportunities that may not be available in their homelands
- Supplement their primary incomes
- A similar entrepreneurial experience that they had at home
- Flexibility to work non-traditional hours around their families

Many turn to running their own operations because of barriers to traditional employment.





Barriers to entrepreneurship for immigrant women may include

- Language deficiencies
- Lack of connectedness to mainstream resources
- Limited access to standard business knowledge
- Cut off from mainstream markets and sources of funding and credit
- Funding



IWEP launched its first class in november of 2012

- Original Goal- to empower immigrant women to follow their dreams and to promote entrepreneurship as a way to financial independence
- That class graduated 13 hard-working women

These women established a trial company which was be used to develop practical business skills

Step 1 – Business Plan Development

- Idea generation
- Market Research & Strategy
- Forming the company (business name, issue of share
- Building the Organization
- Develop the Plan
- Approve the Plan

Step 2 – Operating the Business

- Marketing & Sales
- Production
- Finance & Human Resources
- Information Technology Services
- Administration (Filing, Bookkeeping, etc.)
- Taxation






Clients by country of origin – 2020-2021


Pros
