





Lessons Learned

- Emergency support
- Collaboration is key
- Addressing barriers for migrant workers to fully participate
- Prevention vs. emergency response
- Adaptability



Gaps & Challenges

Funding limitations:

- Short periods of funding is unsustainable
- Restrictions on use of gift cards
- Lacking guidance on use of emergency funds
- Lacking continuity in project officers

Vulnerable workers remain vulnerable

- Closed work permits
- Lacking transparency in investigations of abuse
- Bad employers not being properly sanctioned
- Long processing times, lapse in status

Service Provision:

- Language barriers
- Unwelcoming employers
- Loss of educational materials & resources
- Lacking continuity of projects that started in the pilot
- Staff turnover
