- Priorities include economic stability, social inclusion and community engagement














































Immigration to Hamilton


Number of permanent resident admissions in Hamilton (2015-2022)



Immigration has been on the rise in Hamilton, with 2021 seeing a record high number of immigrant admissions

In 2016, Hamilton had a bigger share of newcomers in the refugee category than Ontario's average.

Ukraine

Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET) launched Mar 2022 to welcome unlimited number of Ukrainians.

 Ukrainian arrivals to Hamilton: around 2,000

Afghanistan



Recent refugee arrivals

- Special measures announced by Government of Canada Aug 2021 to bring 40,000 Afghan refugees.
- New Afghans to Hamilton: almost 600.

Other parts of the



- Wesley continues to welcome Government-Assisted Refugees (GARs) from various parts of the world, including Africa, Middle East and South America
- In 2022, Wesley has welcomed 450 non-Afghan GARs so far

Welcoming and supporting Ukrainians








- Bringing key stakeholders together for a coordinated, proactive response
- Connecting community organizations to City's emergency response

Welcoming and supporting Afghans





- Creating a local taskforce to coordinate efforts
- Connecting with local ethno-cultural association

What has worked?

- Being proactive to respond to emerging crises
- Facilitating collaboration among settlement & non-settlement organizations to support refugees
- Including/leveraging municipal government that has broader interests and resources, including public health, housing, social assistance
 - Connecting with the informal, volunteer-driven associations helping co-ethnics
