
- The Career Pathways for Racialized Newcomer Women (CPRNW) Pilot Project

## **Career Pathways Project**



### **Randomized Control Trial**

361 racialized newcomer women participated in the study.



Participants in the Program Group had access to demand-led occupational specific essential skills training.







needs assessment and developing a learning plan






#### TRAINING:

#### **GENDER BASED ANALYSIS +**

- Targeted programming for racialized newcomer women that considers their intersectional identities can effectively address their complex sets of wants, needs, and barriers and improve their labour market integration
- Example: The analysis found that there were larger increases in career decision-making self-efficacy for participants who had had paid work experience in Canada when joining the program (compared to those without paid work experience in Canada) as well as those who had been in Canada for less than 12 months (compared to those who had been in Canada longer) and those with children (compared to those without).
