

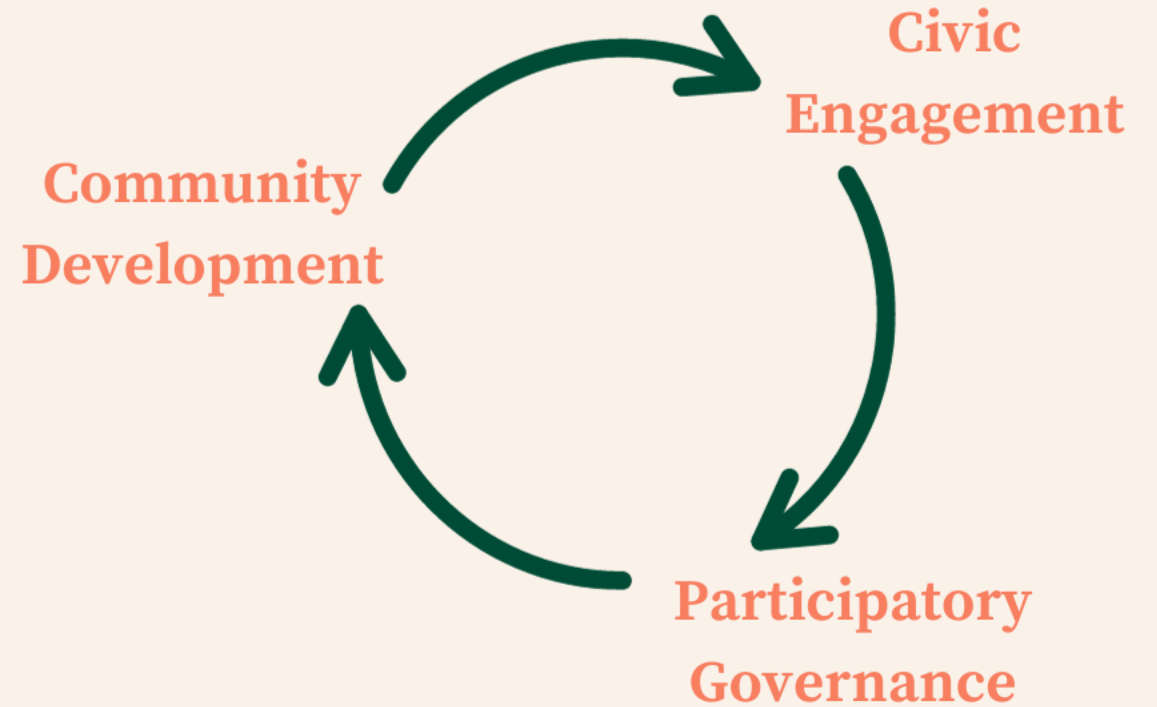

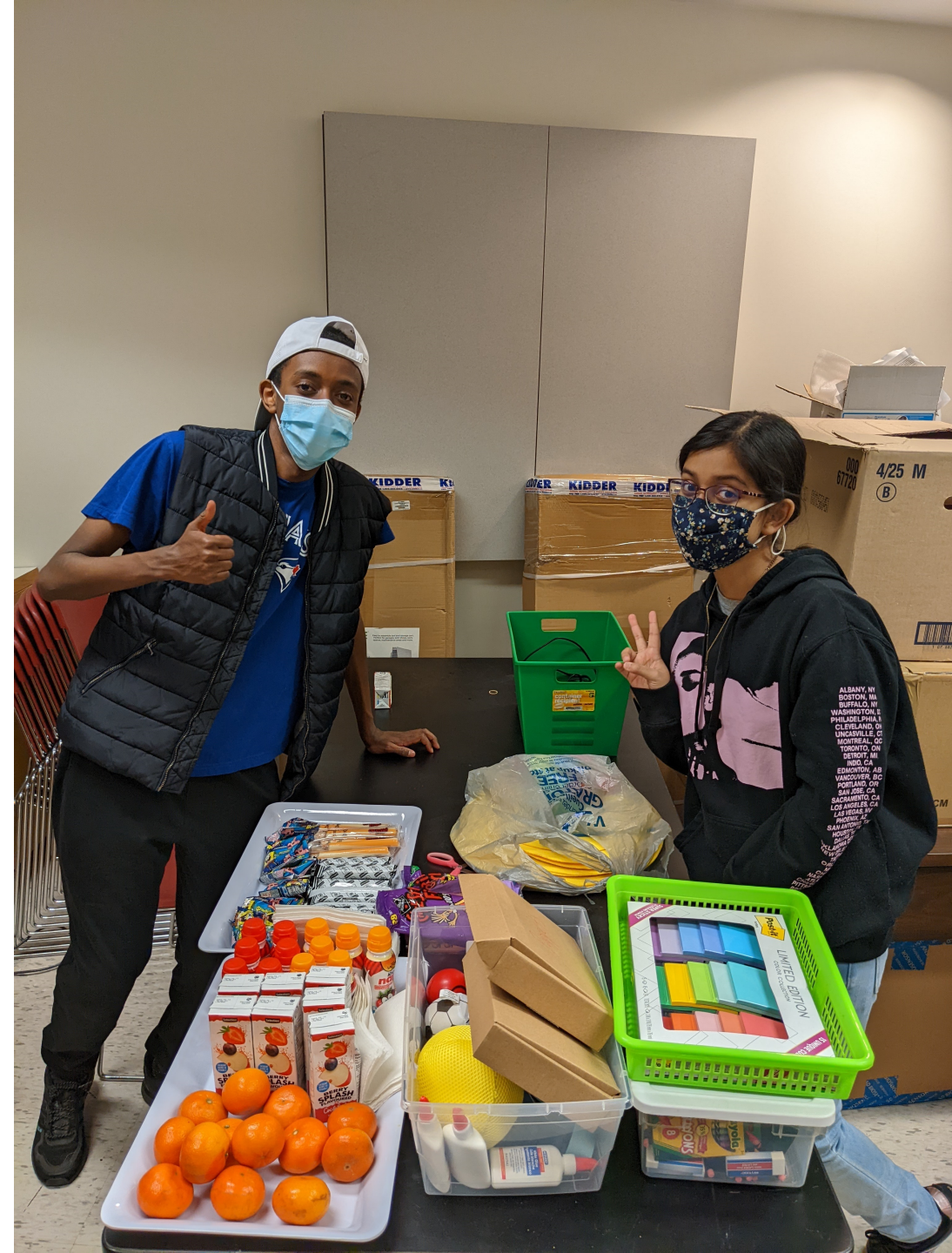

- Funded by IRCC, led by CCS in partnership with UTSC and in close collaboration with TEQ LIP

- Developing a community-based participatory model of governance for local decision-making on newcomer service planning and funding.
- Build Community Capacity

To better address gaps and emerging needs in newcomer service provision in Scarborough by providing an inclusive model for collectively making decisions on newcomer service planning and resource allocation
