### 1. Integration in Quebec

- > Two elements specific to the Quebec case:
  - 1. Mastery of French as a key component for social and professional inclusion
  - 2. Quebec's "interculturalism" as the rationale for integration policies (Bouchard 2011)
- > Focus on immigrants' participation in multiple spheres of life :
- Linguistic participation
- Economic participation
- Cultural participation
- Community participation
- Citizen participation

### 1. Integration in Quebec

### The **Programme d'accompagnement et de soutien à l'intégration** (PASI):

- Funded and administered : by the Ministère de l'Immigration, de la Francisation et de l'Intégration (MIFI)
- Purpose: Support immigrants' settlement and integration in Quebec
- Offered: by community organizations, in cities and regions across the province
- **Program Structure:** Distinct components, individual and group services, serving different immigrant populations.
  - Our project focuses on: integration group activities, facilitating immigrants' participation in Quebec society (Component 2 of the Program)

### 2. Overview of the Project

- The research project is led by Prof. Valérie-Anne Mahéo, at Université Laval, and is funded by MIFI
- A mixed-method project, from 2021 to 2026
  - Interviews, focus groups, social innovation experiments
  - A panel survey with recent immigrants and non-immigrants (2022-2024)
- Focus on: Group activities of the PASI
   and their impact on immigrants' participation
- Project's aim:
  - Identify the profile of users and non-users of PASI activities
  - Identify factors that may hinder or facilitate use of activities
  - Examine which activities are used and by whom
  - ➤ Ultimately, measure the effect of PASI services on the full participation of immigrants in Quebec society

### 2. Overview of the Project

#### First wave of the panel survey:


- Population: Recent Immigrants in Quebec
- Recruitment Method:

E-mail invitation sent by MIFI and partner organizations


- 10,000 e-mails sent by MIFI for an academic survey
- Only adult respondents
- Non-traditional Recruitment: to reach a broad spectrum of immigrants without specific quotas (non-probability/convenience sample)
- Survey administration:
   Online survey (Qualtrics) from April to June 2023
- Response rate: 25%
  - Approximately 18% completed most of the survey (N = 1805)












## 4. PASI Users' and Non-Users' Profiles Reported Enrollment in Group Activities By Region






Are users talking about their experience with the activities, to other immigrants?




## 6. Explaining Use of Integration Activities Factors Linked to Use of Integration Activities

- Preliminary analyses of predictive factors
- Logistic Regression Model explaining 'program use' with multiple variables:
   Age, Gender, Education, Employment Status, First Language, Parental Status,
   Region and Immigration Program
- We present graphs of:
   Predicted probabilities of using PASI services
   Based on various explanatory factors
   (computed with 90% Confidence Intervals)


Predicting the Use of Integration Activities: Age




Predicting the Use of Integration Activities: Region

### 7. Preliminary Findings

#### Popular Activities Among PASI Users:

- Employment and job market workshops
- French discussion workshops
- Cultural activities

#### Socio-Demographic Profile of PASI Users:

- Slightly older
- Predominantly female
- Less likely to live in Montreal

#### Factors Potentially Explaining Integration Activity Use:

- Age
- Region
- Immigration Program

#### > Avenues:

Indications about **how to tailor the communication** about the activities: for whom & for which activities

### 7. Preliminary Findings

- Factors limiting or facilitating use of integration activities:
  - Primary barrier: Not being aware of the existence of these services
  - Other barriers: Lack of time, and perception that they are not necessary
  - ...But high communication of users to their network

#### > Avenues:

- More (and early) communication about the activities
- Communication about the (unexpected) benefits of the activities
- Users as 'ambassadors' of the activities in their network

#### Next Steps:

- Longitudinal analyses:
  - Next waves of the surveys in 2024 & 2025
- Evaluation of the impact of PASI activities on recent immigrants' participation in various spheres of life in Quebec
- Testing various explanations of immigrants' access and use of integration activities
