Our Overall Goals

- To bring together what we know about the causes of **hate** – specifically the hatred of members of one group for another (intergroup hate)
- To think about ways to communicate this to different audiences (e.g., public, youth, policy-makers) with the aim of trying to inoculate them against the drivers of hate

One inoculation strategy is to make people aware that if they are starting to have specific thoughts, say specific things, or behave in certain ways, then hate is on the horizon and they should put the brakes on now

What Do We Mean By Hate

- When we talk about **intergroup hate** in the context of our work, we are **not** talking about hate as a raw emotion. Instead, we are talking about beliefs, attitudes and actions that hurt others based on their group membership.
- We define hate as the mistreatment or endorsement of the mistreatment of others that is seen as justified, necessary and good

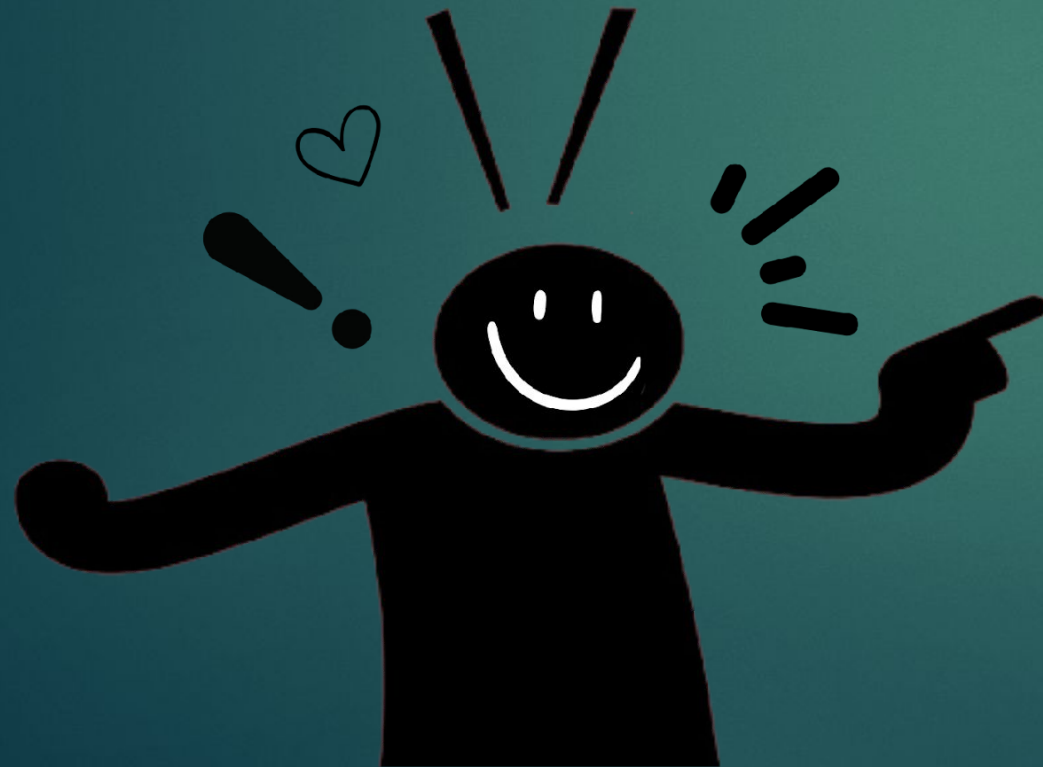

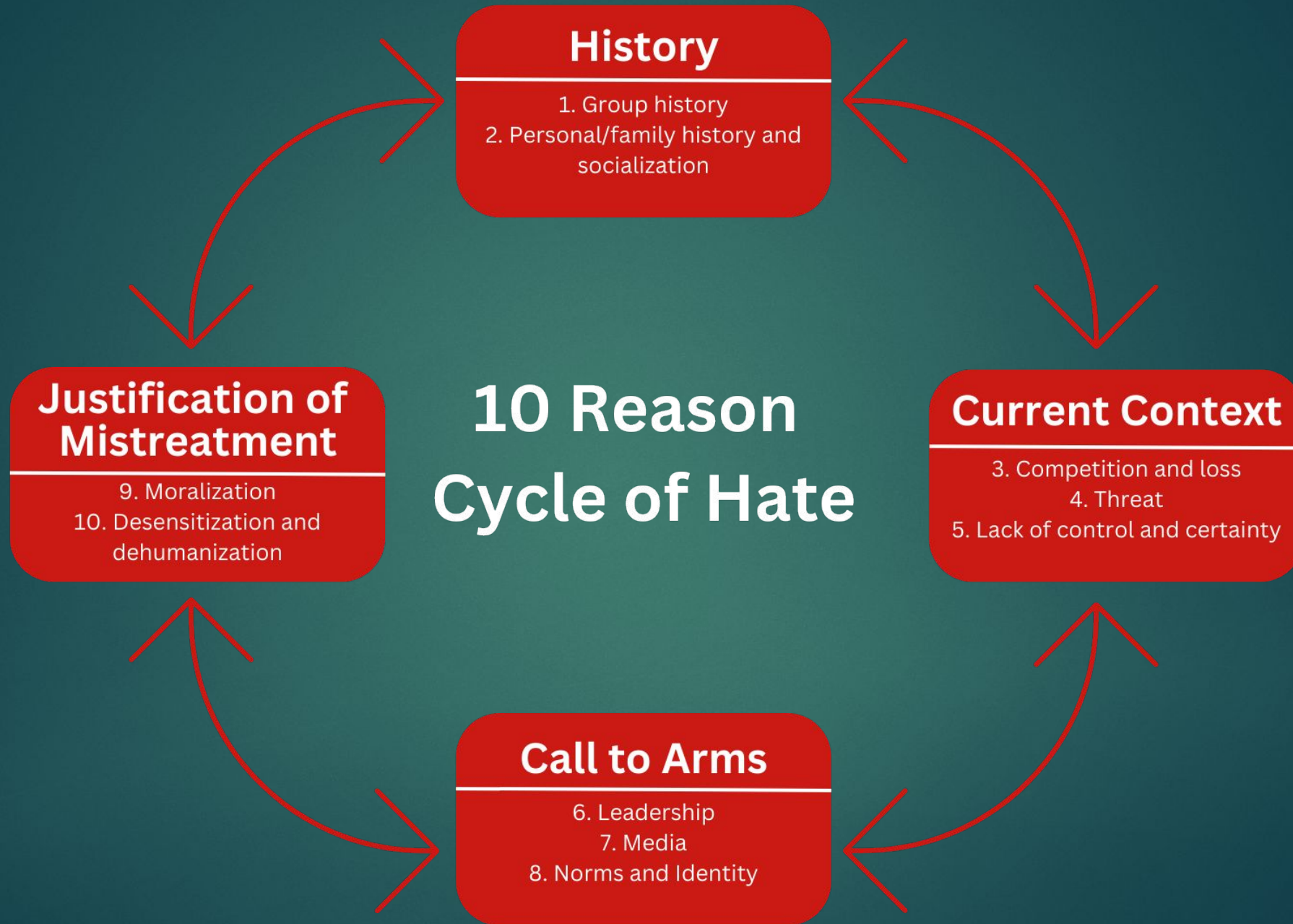
