

Mental health needs in Peel

- Peel has historically been underfunded for mental health and addictions services and these services continue to be a high need priority for Peel residents.
- Only 1 in 3 residents will receive the treatment that they need
- Unmet demand has resulted in long wait times
- Peel had one of the longest wait times for child and youth mental health services at 737 days.



PNSG's work on mental health

- Mental was one of our Strategic priorities for 2020-2025.
- In June 2023, PNSG released a report titled "Newcomer Mental Health
 & Wellness Through a Settlement Sector Lens ".


Recommendations

- 1. Increase collaboration between different sectors supporting mental health of newcomers to create culturally-responsive programs and services.
- 2. Explore a **family-centered approach** to mental health care, with particular attention to newcomer children and youth.




Project goals

- 1. Enhancing understanding of newcomer youth perspectives among sector staff in education, mental health services, and settlement, while **fostering collaboration** across these sectors
- 2. Creating opportunities for youth to engage in **shared learning experiences** through participation in the photovoice process
- 3. Improving culturally-responsive services for newcomer youth / international students needing mental health supports
- 4. Promoting accessible, **family-centered communication** by developing multilingual videos to provide families with clear, accessible pathways to learn about mental wellness and available care options.



Cross sectoral collaborative forum, Nov 2023

- **Purpose:** To identify cross-sectoral connections to help build a network of mental health and wellness support for newcomer youth, young adults, and international students (ages 16-29).
- Attendees: 160 participants from different sectors and 15 booths of available services.
- Evaluation results:
 - 1. Helped build connections among providers across sectors in Peel
 - 2. Learned about cultural competency and areas of interest for future training
 - 3. Learned about different services and programs available

Community Advisory Board (CAB)


- 2 Community Advisory Boards: Newcomer young adult CAB and international student CAB. (16 29 years)
- Activities involved: Photovoice; inputs on wellness spaces, development of trainings; video on stigma reduction; Oct 2024 forum planning; presentation at P2P conference

• Evaluation:


- 1. Network building
- 2. Learning about available services
- 3. Sense of connection and inclusion
- 4. Sense of belonging and giving back to community
- 5. Some felt the time was limited and felt disconnected at times.


Project recommendations
