




Program Objective:

Best Practices

- Conducted comprehensive occupational scans and collaborated with Ontario Restaurant, Hotel and Motel Association (ORHMA) to identify three in-demand occupations.
- The program has successfully created an engagement workflow, assisting the partners to contribute effectively and efficiently towards the project goals.
- The curriculum developed for the three in-demand occupations to be made available to Achēv clients effective March 2025.

Intended Project Outcome

• 2,000 participants access the project's developed training resources

• 1,600 (80%) participants complete one of the project's developed training minicredential

 35 participants from under-represented groups engage in integrated learning and work placement opportunities, of which 28 (80%) secure employment

Specialized Training and Tools

• Three in-demand occupations: Housekeeping Room Attendant, Hotel Front Desk Clerk, Food and Beverage Server • 100% asynchronous online self-paced program with (pre-/post training skills assessment, mandatory occupation specific training)

• In-person placement opportunities for 35 top performers

• Courses and tools will be made available online in English and/or in an alternate accessible format at no cost to Canadians.
